I hope this finds you well. I look forward to see you next week at the planning committee, when our Henley Hall solar park is on the agenda.

As I am sure you know by now, the English Heritage issue has been resolved after a joint meeting on site. Also the land grading question has been fully covered, based on a further independent report, which ratified the conclusions of the initial land grading report. And finally, while every landscape has an intrinsic value, it has also been confirmed that there will be no impacts on the AONB and no harm to the more local landscape based on this screening. Hence recommendation is for approval.

Having said that, I would now normally go with lots of confidence to the Tuesday meeting. However, knowing that 6 out of 6 solar parks that went to planning committee have been refused by it, I am wondering if you have any advice how we can avoid having to go for appeal? I feel this application is better than the previous ones, but still, I would be keen to have your advice to see if there is anything left that could be done by us. I have registered to speak.
